

STAYING FOCUSED ON PET OVERPOPULATION

Over the last 45 years, Actors and Others has focused on the need to curb the pet overpopulation problem by promoting spay and neuter. Our main undertaking has always been to be proactive – not reactive – by preventing unwanted births through sterilization. Today there are many more resources available, but rising costs continue to be a primary obstacle. Last year Actors and Others received a \$50,000 spay/neuter grant from the Petco Foundation in order to help low income pet guardians throughout Riverside County. One of the largest counties in the State, a report issued by U.S. Congressman, Mark Takano, indicated that 400,000 are living in poverty in Riverside County and many more are living on the edge. Under these conditions, pet guardians simply forego having their pets spayed/neutered due to cost. This grant provided free spay/neuter surgeries for 539 dogs and cats. Providing these surgeries will go a long way to help lower the birthrate and curb the number of animals entering the shelter.

The Petco Foundation believes that every animal deserves to live its best life. Since 1999, they have invested more than \$125 million in lifesaving animal welfare work to make that happen. We thank them for helping us improve the lives of so many animals and their guardians.

BE PREPARED WHEN YOUR PET NEEDS A VETERINARIAN



We all love our pets but over their lifetime they can be expensive. The first responsibility as a new pet guardian is to ensure they get all of the required vaccinations, especially for parvo, and are spayed/neutered. When you adopt that fluffy kitten or adorable puppy, you are not thinking of the day they become ill or injured and need veterinary care. But that day will come, and you want to be prepared for your pet and yourself. Have an honest conversation with your veterinarian about cost and your ability to pay. Once you have a diagnosis, do some comparative shopping by calling other veterinarians in your area. You will be surprised at how prices may differ. If you can't afford pet health insurance, put a dollar away each week for that rainy day. It could be a lifesaver.

PETS ARE AFFECTED BY RISING DRUG PRICES



When Mylan raised its price of an EpiPen last year to over \$500, pet guardians were also caught off guard for their pets with life-threatening allergies. Many other drugs such as Phenobarbital for seizures have also seen harsh increases.

Remember you are not required to get your pet's medicine, especially if it is the same as used for humans, from your veterinarian. If you ask they must provide you with a prescription.

Pet Rescue RX donates 100% of its after tax profits to animal welfare organizations. Check out the prices, and if you decide to use them be sure to choose Actors and Others as your charity as choice. Also remember that you do not have to be a member of Costco to use their pharmacy.

TORN LIGAMENTS ARE A COMMON INJURY IN DOGS

Thumper is **Richard V.'s** beloved 6 year old Pit Bull. He adopted him as a puppy from someone giving them away on the street. Richard suffers from a medical issue with his liver and cannot work all the time causing him to take on a lot of debt. On a walk one day, Thumper tore a muscle in his hind right leg. The veterinarian told him surgery was necessary at a cost of over \$5,000. For six months he tried to raise the money for the surgery, but could not do so. For those six months Thumper continued to be in pain, whining all the time and being quite sedentary. Richard too was in great pain watching his buddy suffer. Richard then called us for help. He was willing to drive anywhere to get Thumper the help he needed. We were able to get them to a veterinarian who charged quite a bit less and with our financial helping hand, Thumper is on his way to a full recovery.



One of the most common injuries experienced by dogs is an ACL/CCL ligament tear or rupture. The cost to surgically repair such an injury can range from \$1,800 to over \$5,000. Many dogs will recover well without surgery so it is important for you and for your dog to understand all treatment options. A good website to start your research is <http://tiggerpoz.com>.


NORCO PRISON FERAL CATS

The Norco Prison in Riverside County has about 30 or more cats living on its property, and thanks to the warden approved a TNR program and feeding stations to care for them. Working once again with TNR Riverside, Actors and Others agreed to pay for the spay/neuter costs and 17 cats have been sterilized and returned to the prison to date. We thank TNR Riverside and the prison for being proactive and progressive and helping these cats.



PAW PADS

Don't forget your pet's paw pads that provide traction. The digital and metacarpal pads function as shock absorbers, protecting bones and joints from impact. The carpal pad works like a brake,



helping to negotiate steep or slippery slopes. Weather can irritate your pet's paw pads, so be careful when it is too hot or cold.
